### Latest Coronavirus Update

Following the latest instructions from the Government, St. Mary's can remain open for services within the Covid-19 restrictions. The Church will be open for Holy Communion (CW) on Sundays at 10am and on Wednesday evenings for 'said' Evening Prayer (BCP) at 6.30pm. The weekly short Morning Prayer services using the Sunday Holy Communion readings, and with a short address, will continue to be posted on our website and Facebook pages.

### Tamerton Foliot May Carnival

It is still not clear at the moment whether the Tamerton Foliot May Carnival will go ahead this year, but it definitely won't be in May. The Carnival Committee are meeting on Tuesday this week so we may have more news shortly.

The original plan was for our usual Carnival Concert to take place in Church at 6pm on Wednesday 12th May. The May Carnival was scheduled for Saturday 15th May and the plan was to have St Mary's open, with stewards, and for people to be able to drop in for afternoon tea in aid of Christian Aid as Christian Aid Week ends on that day. The Carnival Service would then be held at 10am on Sunday 16th May.

Hopefully we will be able to confirm things very soon.

### Normal Services Resuming!

Having in mind the latest guidelines of the Government's 'Roadmap' to come out of 'Lockdown', the PCC are planning on a return to our pre-covid pattern of services at the end of June. Subject to any 'slippage' in the Government's plans, our first services will hopefully be held on Sunday 27th June. We would like to hold a special celebration service on that day and the PCC are thinking about what we can do for this. It will also be a chance for people to see the work that has been done in the Church Hall. From July the plan, initially, is to return to our previous pattern of services; but to see how things go and to consider if any changes need to be made.

The full service rotas for chalice assistants, readers and sidespersons will also recommence from July, providing the rules at the time allow.

So some light at the end of the tunnel at long last!
